#### Words of Welcome

One of the most beautiful moments of the High Holy Day season is the <u>hazzan's</u> prayer—the <u>Hineni</u>. It recalls Abraham's answer to God, when given the awful task of bringing his son Isaac to the altar. Abraham answers God with one word: Hineni—here I am. Oftentimes, we look at Abraham's answer as a sign of Abraham's great courage: "Here I am—ready for the task at hand." But the <u>hazzan's</u> prayer belies an entirely different truth. "Here I am," the <u>hazzan</u> chants, "deficient in good deeds; I have come to stand up and plead with You for Your people Israel, even though I am unworthy for the task."

Seen this way, Hineni is a kind of resignation to our fate: try as we might, we can never be fully prepared for the challenges life puts in front of us. We are never fully in control. Yet one of the uniting truths of the human existence is that we will all face Hineni moments—moments when our faith is rocked to the core. In those moments, our only choice is to say Hineni: prepared or not, here I am.

As challenging as that reality is, our Days of Awe also remind us of Judaism's powerful response to this challenge. While we travel through lives as individuals, Judaism helps us to encounter life in the context of community. While, at times, it may seem that our troubles are unique to us, or too great to carry, Judaism reminds us that we do not have to do it alone. On Yom Kippur, we pray together. We fast together. We confess our sins together. We shed tears and we grieve together. All as individuals. All as a community. At the end of our 25 hours together fasting, we hear the great blast of the shofar together, shattering our solemnity with its joyous call to redemption. As we enter the new year, let us remember that our path to redemption begins with us. Let our time together strengthen our bonds of community. May the coming year be one of support and love.

We wish you all the best for an easy and meaningful fast and a sweet, happy, and healthy new year!

## Safety & Security

The rising tide of anti-Jewish violence in recent years has caused us to be ever vigilant of the level of security necessary to protect all of us. Therefore, we continue to make changes to our physical structure and to our procedures to increase the safety of every person who walks through our doors. We know some of these changes may be inconvenient, and we appreciate you taking an active role in our security to keep us all safe. Our gates and access system are fully functional, with a single entry to the upper campus from the parking lot. Your card or app will also allow you to move from the Alternative Service in the Social Hall to the Sanctuary via the pathway gate. If you have any questions about your access, whether by app or by keycard, please contact Executive Director Stu Kirsch. In the event of any incident, please calmy and efficiently follow the instructions given by Rabbi Stein, our High Holy Day incident leader Stu Kirsch, and law enforcement officials.

If you have any questions about security at B'nai Shalom, please see a greeter or Stu Kirsch, or the leaders of our Safety and Security Team, Earl Agron, David Eliaser, or Michael Tejeda.

### **Emergency Preparedness and Special Needs**

Greeters and other leaders have been instructed in the location of our AEDs (automated external defibrillator) and First Aid supplies.

There is an AED in the lobby, above which is an emergency kit containing basic first-aid supplies. There is also an AED by the front door of the social hall.

We are requesting that doctors and nurses in the community volunteer to be part of the First Responder team. If you would like to participate in this mitzvah, please tell the greeters at the desk your name and approximate location at which you will be sitting.

### Walking up to the Bimah in the Main Sanctuary

We have found that there is increasing concern about congregants slipping, falling, or losing their balance when going up to the Bimah for an honor. When you are called to the Bimah for an ark opening, an Aliyah, a Torah reading, to blow the shofar, or to deliver an English reading, please approach from the ramp side of the sanctuary and return to your seat using the same ramp.





Please note that Erev Simhat Torah services will include a dedication ceremony in memory of October 7.
